Great Oaks Wilderness Sanctuary: A Natural Wonder



In February 2026, Francis Small Heritage Trust (FSHT) became the official holder of a conservation easement on very special land in Parsonsfield owned by the Northeast Wilderness Trust (NEWT) and named the Great Oaks Wilderness Sanctuary.

This extraordinary property is known locally as Dearborn Mountain with its scenic summit to the south of the North Road in Parsonsfield, and northerly to land across North Road down through a field and woodlot to 1,600 feet of frontage on West Pond. These 553.65 acres were formerly owned by the Arthur and Laura Lougee family, and were gifted by their heirs, acting legally as the Lougee Conservancy, to the Northeast Wilderness Trust to conserve as defined by a conservation easement now held by FSHT.

In essence, the protected property will be held as forever wild land that will allow passive public use but prohibit any use that would impair or interfere with the natural life of the property. Although there are no official trails and none are planned, the land remains open for pedestrian access.

The conservation easement outlines the intention of the Lougee Conservancy to protect the native plants, animals, soil, and water of the Great Oaks Wilderness Sanctuary, and the Francis Small Heritage Trust has agreed to regularly monitor the property to assure that the well-defined terms of the conservation easement are upheld in perpetuity.

FSHT has Exciting Events Coming up this Summer!

June 6, 10-11 am: Black locust flower foraging at Ingalls Pond. Black locust flowers are a short-lived flower that taste somewhat like sweet fresh peas. We will be foraging black locust flowers on young trees along the railroad tracks and sharing recipes for the flowers. FSHT is offering this course in conjunction with Sacopee Valley Adult & Community Education. See below for registration and information.

June 13-July 31: For the children and the child in all of us, there will be a storywalk at Jagolinzer Preserve (Moon Over Malibu, Maine, by Tonya Shevenell, a story about the moon, full moon fun, and cooperation)

June 26, 8:30 pm: Moonlight hike, Jagolinzer Preserve. Join us for a full moon hike at Jagolinzer Preserve. Please bring red lights only to prevent night blindness. We will also have red cellophane to cover white lights if you don't own a red light. FSHT is

offering this course in conjunction with Sacopee Valley Adult & Community Education. See below for registration information.

July 17 - August 31: FSHT Trail Challenge: Two ability level challenges to hike multiple FSHT trails, take a rubbing at the end, learn a bit about our properties, and if all are completed, win a local prize. A raffle will also be drawn from the names of the people who complete all the trails for an REI gift card.

August 8: Mushroom foray by Alisha Langerman and Evan O'Day of Meadowfall Farm and Forage at Bald Ledge. We will meet at the Colcord trailhead.

Proposed Accessible Trails: Community Voices Shape the Future of Outlet Park in Waterboro and Norton Hill in Porter

FSHT has taken a significant step forward in its mission of inclusive conservation with its recent hosting of public listening sessions on two separate "All Persons" trail proposals. The Trust is seeking grant support through the Maine Trails Program (MTP) to bring these community resources to life.

April 8: Outlet Park in Waterboro

Summary:

- 11.7-acre parcel located on New Dam Road with 600 feet of water frontage on Lake Arrowhead.
- A level, compacted stone-dust trail that complies with ADA standards for wheelchair access.
- A loop design for the trail.
- Daytime-only access to the public for hikers, walkers, and runners.
- Accessible park benches.
- Leashed dogs would be welcome.
- The proposed park would NOT have water, restrooms, or electricity.
- The project will go through the Planning Board process with a formal public hearing.

Highlights:

- ◇ Abutters shared concerns about unleashed dogs, litter, parking on neighbors' driveways, and disrespectful or unruly behavior.
- ◇ FSHT acknowledged and assured that we are open to installing trash cans, putting up bounda-

ry signs, "Stay on marked trail" signs, and working with the town on "No Parking" signs along New Dam Road. FSHT can also install additional signage as necessary if behaviors of trail users necessitate it.

- ◇ Residents expressed appreciation for the work of FSHT to preserve natural lands.
- ◇ Abutters asked for the trail to be centered in the property and FSHT is planning on having generous vegetated buffer areas between neighboring properties.
- ◇ Several residents noted the importance of providing Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible outdoor recreation options and provided suggestions to ensure that the site is truly welcome to those with mobility limitations.

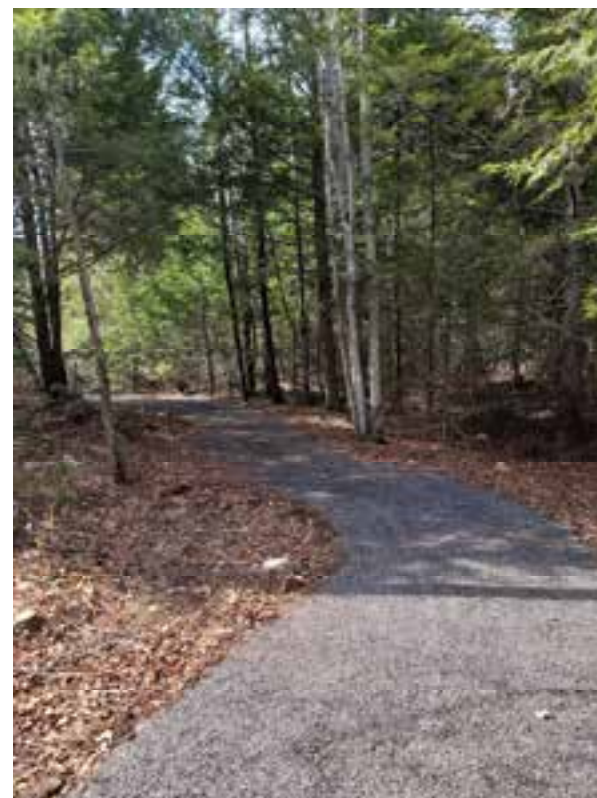
April 16: Norton Hill in Porter

Summary:

- Ten to twelve vehicle parking area at 250 Norton Hill Road.
- A half mile wheelchair accessible, compact gravel trail with a gradual 165 foot elevation gain leading to a minor summit with scenic northern views.
- Trail design maintains 100 foot buffer from vernal pools and intermittent wetlands.
- Commitment to preserve the land's history, including the David Colcord and Thomas Brooks homestead sites.

Highlights:

- ◇ Attendees expressed general support for the project, as Trust board members addressed specific questions regarding potential increased road traffic, possible inappropriate use (such as by motorized vehicles), erosion due to rain water, and desired environmental protection for local wetlands.

New Acquisition Projects:

FSHT is also currently working to secure grant funding for the purchase of a 50-acre parcel in the Sawyer Mountain Highlands and a 162-acre parcel below Devils Den in Porter.

Volunteers Dick, Robin, and Sheryl had a hospitality table waiting at the finish line, complete with steaming hot chocolate, tea, and a variety of "tidbits." The star of the show, however, was undoubtedly the coconut chocolate chip cookies.

This event was a collaboration with Sacopec Valley Adult and Continuing Education (SVACE) and serves as a reminder of why we protect these spaces—to enjoy them together, regardless of the thermostat!

Question 1. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds and/or bond anticipation notes in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$378,000 for the purpose of financing the following capital expenditures for the Town's Public Safety Department: 1.) Unit 2 chief vehicle replacement, 2.) a traffic control vehicle, 3.) cardiac monitors, 4.) dry hydrant replacement, 5.) boat launch upgrades, 6.) ten (10) AED devices, and 7.) a ¾ ton vehicle with plow, all as set forth in the Council's proposed capital projects budget for the 2026-2027 Fiscal Year, with the dates, maturities, denominations, interest rate(s) and other details of such borrowing to be determined by the Municipal Officers, and to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the proceeds of said bonds or bond anticipation notes for the foregoing projects, plus an amount necessary to refund the interest payments on any bond anticipation notes issued for said purpose and any costs of issuance of the bonds and/or bond anticipation notes.

(Note: These capital expenditures will be financed from a portion of the proceeds of general obligation bonds to be issued in a total principal amount of up to \$3,455,909. Total estimated debt service is \$3,802,555.71, of which principal is \$3,455,909 and estimated interest at variable interest rates between 2.89% to 3.45% over 10 years is \$346,646.71)

The Public Safety Department is seeking approval for capital expenditures.

1. We are looking to replace Unit 2 – (Fire Chief's Command Vehicle) with a pick-up truck. This will allow the chief to carry our command and other response equipment safely as well as giving us the ability to have another vehicle to tow some of our trailered equipment (Boat, ATV, Light Tower) as needed. The chief's current vehicle will be repurposed to the code enforcement department for their needs.
2. Traffic 8 control vehicle replacement - Currently we are using 2010 repurposed 2-wheel drive cargo van. This vehicle is used to carry traffic control equipment that needs to be quickly deployed to set up detours and lane closures to create safe work zones at emergency scenes. We are looking to replace this vehicle with a used 4-wheel drive van with a work body style to allow for the safe transport and deployment of our traffic control devices.
3. Cardiac Monitors – We are working on getting onto a 3-year cycle with our cardiac monitors. The plan is to purchase 1 monitor every 3 years. We currently have 3 monitors so with this plan, they will be updated accordingly.
4. Dry Hydrants – This is for the installation of dry hydrants in areas of the town that do not have pressurized hydrants. They are typically installed near large brooks, lakes and ponds, that give us a water source in those areas to draft water for fires.
5. Boat Launch Upgrades – This is to make the boat launch ADA compliant by making a safe travel area for pedestrians and wheelchairs from the upper parking area to the lower launch area. It is suggested to do this as it will give the town the ability to qualify for more grant funding.
6. Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) This is to replace the 10 AEDs that are on the apparatus and support vehicles. These units are currently 12 years old and are due for replacement.
7. ¾ Ton Pick-Up with a plow package- This vehicle will be replacing the current pick-up truck at Central Station. This vehicle is to assist during snowstorms with timely patient access during a medical emergency, scene access during fires and storms, and assist the crews after storms to clear out the nearly 200 fire hydrants that need to be shoveled out. It is also used to tow our trailered equipment, emergency scene clean-up (ie. hose, tools, haz-mat equipment, etc.), and other items that are needed for the department.

Question 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds and/or bond anticipation notes in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$105,000 for the purpose of financing the following capital expenditures for Town General Administration: 1.) technology server replacement and 2.) exterior maintenance at the Town Hall, as set forth in the Council's proposed capital projects budget for the 2026-2027 Fiscal Year, with the dates, maturities, denominations, interest rate(s) and other details of such borrowing to be determined by the Municipal Officers, and to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the proceeds of said bonds or bond anticipation notes for the foregoing projects, plus an amount necessary to refund the interest payments on any bond anticipation notes issued for said purpose and any costs of issuance of the bonds and/or bond anticipation notes.

(Note: These capital expenditures will be financed from a portion of the proceeds of general obligation bonds to be issued in a total principal amount of up to \$3,455,909. Total estimated debt service is \$3,802,555.71, of which principal is \$3,455,909 and estimated interest at variable interest rates between 2.89% to 3.45% over 10 years is \$346,646.71)

- 1.) The town currently has a piece of equipment called a DATTO server. The DATTO is our main backup. It backs up the files on the file server offsite every 1 hour and can act as the main file server in case of an emergency to keep the town's files accessible. It has come to the end of its useful life. It is imperative that it be replaced to ensure all the town's files are securely backed up in case of a catastrophic event.
- 2.) The Town Hall requires attention to exterior maintenance needs. Areas of the exterior paint are chipping and deteriorating, leaving surfaces exposed to weather-related damage and accelerating structural wear. Additionally, the gutter system is failing in multiple sections, resulting in improper drainage that may lead to water intrusion, foundation issues, and long-term damage if not addressed. Exterior doors have also shown signs of degradation, including compromised sealing and functionality, which impacts both security and energy efficiency. These issues, while manageable if not addressed promptly, will continue to worsen over time maintaining and increase repair costs if delayed.

As Town Hall is a key public facility, its exterior integrity is essential to ensure continued operational effectiveness and to uphold a positive public image.

Question 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds and/or bond anticipation notes in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$38,000 for the purpose of financing a capital expenditure for the Town's Parks and Recreation Department: 1.) Mill Street parking and bus parking, as set forth in the Council's proposed capital projects budget for the 2026-2027 Fiscal Year, with the dates, maturities, denominations, interest rate(s) and other details of such borrowing to be determined by the Municipal Officers, and to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the proceeds of said bonds or bond anticipation notes for the foregoing projects, plus an amount necessary to refund the interest payments on any bond anticipation notes issued for said purpose and any costs of issuance of the bonds and/or bond anticipation notes.

(Note: These capital expenditures will be financed from a portion of the proceeds of general obligation bonds to be issued in a total principal amount of up to \$3,455,909. Total estimated debt service is \$3,802,555.71, of which principal is \$3,455,909 and estimated interest at variable interest rates between 2.89% to 3.45% over 10 years is \$346,646.71)

- 1.) The Parks & Recreation Department is requesting funds for the paving of Mill Street Park parking lot and the Parks & Recreation storage building located at town hall. Paving Mill Street parking lot will help reduce tripping hazards caused by potholes, ruts, mud, uneven gravel and provide safer walking surfaces for children, seniors, and improve ADA accessibility. The Parks & Recreation storage building paving would help with employee safety eliminating uneven gravel, mud, and potholes that will reduce the risk of slips, trips, and falls. The recreation buses and equipment also are currently parked in dirt adjacent to the parks building - increasing the risk of moisture, resulting in rust and corrosion on the undercarriage of the vehicle. This would help extend the lifespan of town vehicles and assist in reducing repair costs.

Question 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds and/or bond anticipation notes in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$315,000 for the purpose of financing a capital expenditure for the Town’s Public Works Department:

1.) Truck 3 with plow gear, all as set forth in the Council’s proposed capital projects budget for the 2026-2027 Fiscal Year, with the dates, maturities, denominations, interest rate(s) and other details of such borrowing to be determined by the Municipal Officers, and to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the proceeds of said bonds or bond anticipation notes for the foregoing projects, plus an amount necessary to refund the interest payments on any bond anticipation notes issued for said purpose and any costs of issuance of the bonds and/or bond anticipation notes.

(Note: These capital expenditures will be financed from a portion of the proceeds of general obligation bonds to be issued in a total principal amount of up to \$3,455,909. Total estimated debt service is \$3,802,555.71, of which principal is \$3,455,909 and estimated interest at variable interest rates between 2.89% to 3.45% over 10 years is \$346,646.71)

1.) The Public Works Department is asking to acquire a new single axle Plow/Sand Truck to replace a 2011 International Single Axle Plow/Sander Truck that covers the Northeast Road area plow route. The current truck has reached its life cycle end (15 years projected) for the town showing significant rust and having mechanical issues. The truck had many breakdowns during this plow season requiring time consuming repairs. The Town’s Capital Plan calls for its replacement.

Question 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds and/or bond anticipation notes in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$1,142,293 for the purpose of financing capital expenditures for pavement maintenance to the following Town roads: Bonny Eagle Road, Corey Lane, Liza Lane, Spear Road, Sunrise Street, Sunrise Street-I, and Whites Bridge Road, all as set forth in the Council’s proposed capital projects budget for the 2026-2027 Fiscal Year, with the dates, maturities, denominations, interest rate(s) and other details of such borrowing to be determined by the Municipal Officers, and to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the proceeds of said bonds or bond anticipation notes for the foregoing projects, plus an amount necessary to refund the interest payments on any bond anticipation notes issued for said purpose and any costs of issuance of the bonds and/or bond anticipation notes.

(Note: These capital expenditures will be financed from a portion of the proceeds of general obligation bonds to be issued in a total principal amount of up to \$3,455,909. Total estimated debt service is \$3,802,555.71, of which principal is \$3,455,909 and estimated interest at variable interest rates between 2.89% to 3.45% over 10 years is \$346,646.71)

1. The Town’s Capital Plan for paving maintenance calls for these roads to be repaved. A shim layer and an overlay of pavement will be done to repave these roads. There will be grinding and milling on limited sections of Whites Bridge Road and Bonny Eagle Road to help with road cross slopes and delamination of pavement. Most of these roads have not been paved in over 20 years.

Question 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Council, to (i) enter into a Waste Handling and Recycling Agreement with EcoMaine to handle and process the Town’s solid waste and recycling; (ii) enter into an Interlocal Solid Waste Agreement with other municipalities and other related agreements for the purpose of owning and operating EcoMaine, a nonprofit corporation that handles and processes municipal solid waste and recyclable materials, and (iii) issue a \$1,477,616 general obligation promissory note in the name of the Town for a term of up to 30 years at 0% interest (the “Note”), which Note may be made callable, to finance the buy-in amount for the Town to join the Interlocal Solid Waste Agreement.

Copies of the Waste Handling and Recycling Agreement, Interlocal Solid Waste Agreement, and related agreements are available for review at the Town Clerk’s office at Town Hall at 175 Northeast Rd, Standish, ME and on the Town’s website

1. EcoMaine disposes of all of the Town of Standish’s Household Waste and Bulky Waste at their facility in Portland. The Town of Standish has been in a contract agreement with EcoMaine for the past 20 years. Our contract is due to expire in June of 2027. The most cost-effective way is continuing with EcoMaine as an Owner Town and not under contract. This is estimated to save the taxpayers over 1 million dollars in a 30-year period by becoming an Owner Town. Over 30 years it is estimated the Town will pay as an Owner Town \$20,827,194 with tipping fees and buy in payment but under Contract only the Town would pay \$21,827,404 for the same amount of waste. This is over 1 million in savings by becoming an Owner Town. The Owner Towns pay much less in tipping fees vs being under contract, for example; Owner Towns would pay \$136 per ton in FY35, and Contract Towns would pay \$156 per ton for household waste. Being an Owner Town allows the town to have a board member to help set the tipping rates for disposal. Most all surrounding towns to include Windham, Gorham, Buxton and Limington are Owner Towns in Ecomaine and not under contract.

Financial Statement: The following financial statement applies to Questions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 above. The issuing of bonds by the Town of Standish is one of the ways in which the Town borrows money for certain purposes. When money is borrowed by issuing bonds, the Town must repay not only the principal amount of the bonds but also interest on the bonds. The amount of interest to be paid will vary depending upon the rate of interest and the years to maturity at the time of issue. The validity of the bonds and of the voters’ ratification of the bonds may not be affected by any errors on the estimates made of the costs involved, including varying interest rates, the estimated cost of interest on the bond amount to be issued and the total cost of principal and interest to be paid at maturity. If the actual amount of the total debt service for the bond issues varies from the estimate, the ratification by the electors is nevertheless conclusive and the validity of the bond issue is not affected by reason of the variance.

DATE CHANGE OF THE JUNE 2026 STANDISH TOWN COUNCIL MEETING AND NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The regular meeting of the Standish Town Council in June has been CHANGED from June 9, 2026 to Tuesday, June 2, 2026

The Municipal Officers of the Town of Standish will hold the following Public Hearing at the Council Chambers, Standish Municipal Center, 175 Northeast Road, Standish at 6:00 P.M. on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, to act on the following ordinance amendment:

33-26 Amendments to Standish Town Code, Chapter 181, Changes to § 181-7.1 Form Based Code Village Districts [Watson]

An order to revise the Form Based Code Village District zoning requirements to make them easier to use by simplifying and consolidating language; removing redundant, unenforceable, and cumbersome requirements; and providing landowners and developers with greater flexibility in lot layout and design. Specifically it will reduce the number of street frontage types, consolidate sign regulations, relax building form standards, change front setbacks so as to allow limited parking in front of structures, revise road design standards, bring lot size requirements into compliance with state law, and a variety of smaller edits aimed at making the section easier to read and apply.

34-26 Amendments to Standish Town Code, Chapter 181, Blasting [Watson]

An order to revise the blasting section to require all blasting to notice abutters and provide pre-blast surveys and well tests to nearby abutters. This order will also narrow the existing requirement for any blasting within 200ft of a property line to receive written permission of the abutting property owner such that it will only apply to blasting associated with a gravel pit and not apply to blasting associate with general construction.

35-26 Amendments to Standish Town Code, Chapter 181, Capital Impact Fees [Watson]

This order will create a new impact fee to support improvements to the Route 25 corridor so that it can handle additional traffic created by new residential development. The order will also address some minor changes to the rest of the impact fee section, including creating an exemption from impact fees for new dwelling units which are replacing existing dwelling units and so are not creating new demand on town services.

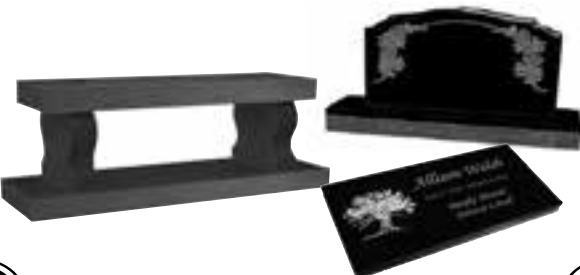

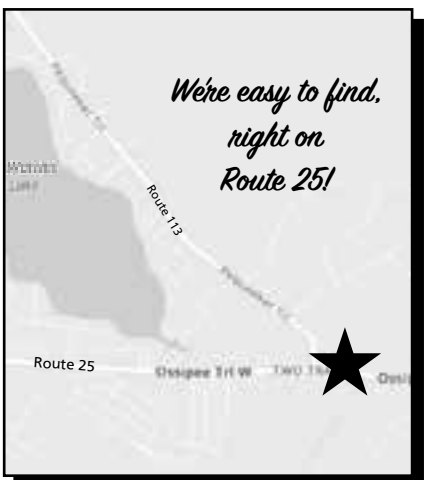

Source Water Information

DESCRIPTION OF WATER SOURCE: Wells (4) – primary source are two 50’ gravel packed wells located at Pavilion Road that could pump approximately 150,000 gallons of water per day from one of the largest aquifers in the state of Maine. Our secondary source is two 500’ bedrocks wells at Northwood Drive and have the capacity to pump approximately 50,000 gallons per day. The two source locations could pump approximately 200,000 gallons daily.

WATER TREATMENT & FILTRATION INFORMATION: Our comprehensive water treatment program includes sodium hypochlorite (chlorine) to protect against water born disease. We also use caustic soda to control the pH level of the water.

SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENT: The sources of drinking water include rivers, lakes, ponds, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and radioactive material and can pick up substances resulting from human or animal activity. The Maine Drinking Water Program (DWP) has evaluated all public water supplies as part of the Source Water Assessment Program (SWAP). The assessments included geology, hydrology, land uses, water testing information, and the extent of land ownership or protection by local ordinance to see how likely our drinking water source is to being contaminated by human activities in the future. Assessment results are available at town offices and public water systems.

Water Test Results

- Action Level (AL):** The concentration of a contaminant that, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements that a water system must follow.
- Locational Running Annual Average (LRAA):** A 12 month rolling average of all monthly or quarterly samples at specific sampling locations. Calculation of the RAA may contain data from the previous year.
- Maximum Contaminant Level or MCL:** The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.
- Maximum Contaminant Level Goal or MCLG:** The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.
- Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL):** The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.
- Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG):** The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.
- Running Annual Average (RAA):** A 12 month rolling average of all monthly or quarterly samples at all locations. Calculation of the RAA may contain data from the previous year.
- Secondary Maximum Contaminant Level (SMCL):** Non-mandatory water quality standards.
- Treatment Technique (TT):** A required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

Notes:

- 1) Arsenic: While your drinking water may meet EPA's standard for Arsenic, if it contains between 5 to 10 ppb you should know that the standard balances the current understanding of arsenic's possible health effects against the costs of removing it from drinking water. EPA continues to research the health effects of low levels of arsenic, which is a mineral known to cause cancer in humans at high concentrations and is linked to other health effects such as skin damage and circulatory problems. Quarterly compliance is based on running annual average.
- 2) E. coli: E. coli are bacteria whose presence indicates that the water may be contaminated with human or animal wastes. Human pathogens in these wastes can cause short-term effects, such as diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms. They may pose a greater health risk for infants, young children, the elderly, and people with severely-compromised immune systems.
- 3) Fluoride: For those systems that fluoridate, fluoride levels must be maintained between 0.5 to 1.2 ppm. The optimum level is 0.7 ppm.
- 4) Gross Alpha: Action level over 5 pCi/L requires testing for Radium 226 and 228. Action level over 15 pCi/L requires testing for Uranium. Compliance is based on Gross Alpha results minus Uranium results = Net Gross Alpha.
- 5) Lead/Copper: Action levels (AL) are measured at consumer's tap. 90% of the tests must be equal to or below the action level.
- 6) Nitrate: Nitrate in drinking water at levels above 10 ppm is a health risk for infants of less than six months of age. High nitrate levels in drinking water can cause blue baby syndrome. Nitrate levels may rise quickly for short periods of time because of rainfall or agricultural activity. If you are caring for an infant you should ask advice from your health provider.
- 7) PFAS: The degree of risk depends on the level of chemicals and duration of exposure. Laboratory studies of animals exposed to high doses of PFAS have shown numerous negative effects such as issues with reproduction, growth and development, thyroid function, immune system, neurology, as well as injury to the liver. Research is still relatively new, and more needs to be done to fully assess exposure effects on the human body.
- 8) Radon: The State of Maine adopted a Maximum Exposure Guideline (MEG) for Radon in drinking water at 4000 pCi/L, effective 1/1/07. If Radon exceeds the MEG in water, treatment is recommended. It is also advisable to test indoor air for Radon.
- 9) Total Coliform Bacteria: Reported as the highest monthly number of positive samples, for water systems that take less than 40 samples per month.
- 10) TTHM/HAA5: Total Trihalomethanes and Haloacetic Acids (TTHM and HAA5) are formed as a by-product of drinking water chlorination. This chemical reaction occurs when chlorine combines with naturally occurring organic matter in water. Compliance is based on LRAA.
- 11) Turbidity: Turbidity has no health effects. However, turbidity can interfere with disinfection and provide a medium for microbial growth. Turbidity may indicate the presence of disease-causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites that can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea and associated headaches.

Health Information

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.

Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.

Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban stormwater runoff, and residential uses.

Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production and can also come from gas stations, urban runoff, and septic systems.

Radioactive Contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Lead and Copper

Lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Your public water system is responsible for providing high quality drinking water and removing lead pipes, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components in your home. You share the responsibility for protecting yourself and your family from the lead in your home plumbing. You can take responsibility by identifying and removing lead materials within your home plumbing and taking steps to reduce your family's risk. 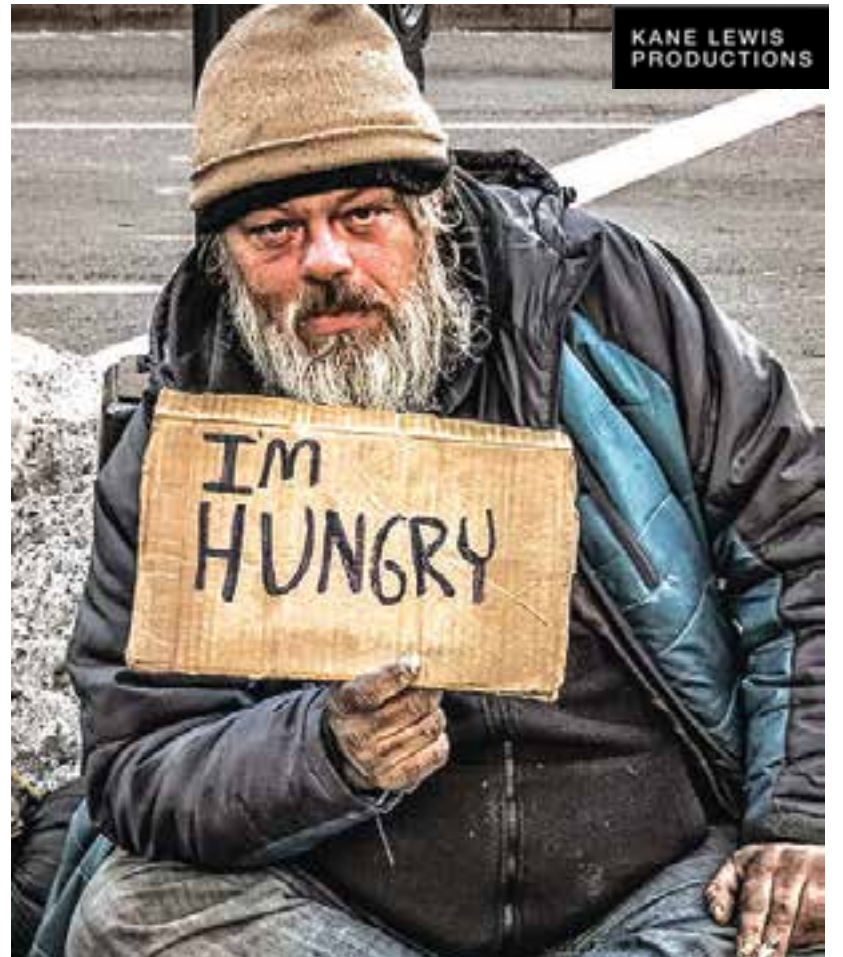

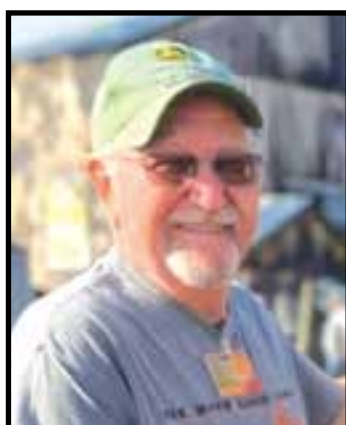
